The ancient drum is beating as the Goddesses of the Dawn dance in the first rays of light. They know that their time has come. The Goddesses of the Dawn remember their roots. They have the courage to dive into the soil, go below the surface and face the dark. And they are bold enough to stretch their arms high towards the light.

Marjut Tuulia Numminen is 39-years-old artist who combines blown and flameworked glass with natural stones and crystals creating high vibrational art pieces. She gets most of her ideas and inspiration in the forest laying down on the moss her feet firmly on the soil. Drum trips, beautiful ceremonies and the company of other sacred women keeps the artistic creativity flowing. Marjut Tuulia works in her own studio in Janakkala, in the south of Finland. Her bigger glass pieces she blows in Nuutajärvi with Aino Vilpas.
